DCA, Defense Cooperation Agreement

DCA, Defense Cooperation Agreement, is a bilateral, military agreement between the United States and Sweden authorizing American military unimpeded access to and use of Swedish territory, waters, and airspace. Through the DCA, the U.S. has gained access to 17 military base areas in Sweden, out of a total of 49 in the Nordic countries, to store military equipment and weapons as well as access to all the Swedish territory to enable transfers and military strategic operations according to the defined needs of the United States. The purpose of the agreement is to enable fast and efficient transport and movement of the US military forces, weapons and military equipment between countries without taking into account differences in national legislation between the countries. The U.S. has at the moment similar agreements with 16 countries in Europe.

Introduction

The agreement was signed by the Swedish and U.S. ministers of defense – Pål Jonson and Lloyd Austin – in Washington on the 5th of December 2023. It is established practice by Swedish governments that agreements expected to get support by the majority of the parliament are signed already before the vote in the parliament takes place. The contract-based information about DCA can be found on the website of the government (links at the end of this report). A memorandum as a basis for the coming debate and decision-making process in the parliament was made public during the spring of 2024. It was sent to a large number of referral bodies, among those all of the agreement directly affected municipalities. Several critical comments were received during the referral round, among others from the Faculty of Law at Stockholm University, the Swedish Peace and Arbitration Society, and the Rescue Service East Blekinge to mention but a few. A great number of private referral statements were delivered, those however not being available digitally. The negative comments had no effect, and there was only one interpellation debate in the parliament during the spring. A name collection was implemented by the so-called Referendum Campaign collecting more than 40'000 signatures in support of a referendum on the DCA. This name collection was ignored, and the parliamentary vote on DCA was held on the 18th of June 2024. A majority voted for ratification. The implementation of the agreement was initiated on the 15th of August 2024.

Through the agreement the U.S. personnel are granted far-reaching rights in Sweden as well as freedoms from Swedish legislation regarding, among other things, criminal law, customs, right of use of Swedish land and import and export of goods without Swedish right to control. The U.S. also has the right to bring nuclear weapons into Sweden without Swedish control or veto. The agreement is written for 10 years and then continues to be valid on an ongoing basis. It is after that possible to cancel if either party wishes to do so and mentions it at least one year in advance. The agreement itself is very unspecified and vague. As it is implemented it will be followed-up by special bilateral deliberations and agreements on how it will be implemented in detail and what will apply then.

DCA includes 17 Swedish base areas, and in addition locations are affected where military development, testing, and production occur. The bases are situated across the entire country and will now step by step be put into use. Already there are testimonies of restricted public access to the countryside and a strong environmental impact. This report is a compilation of observations and testimonies of how the civilian population, civil society, and environment are affected by the increased military activities on and around the localities, where the base areas affected by the DCA are located.

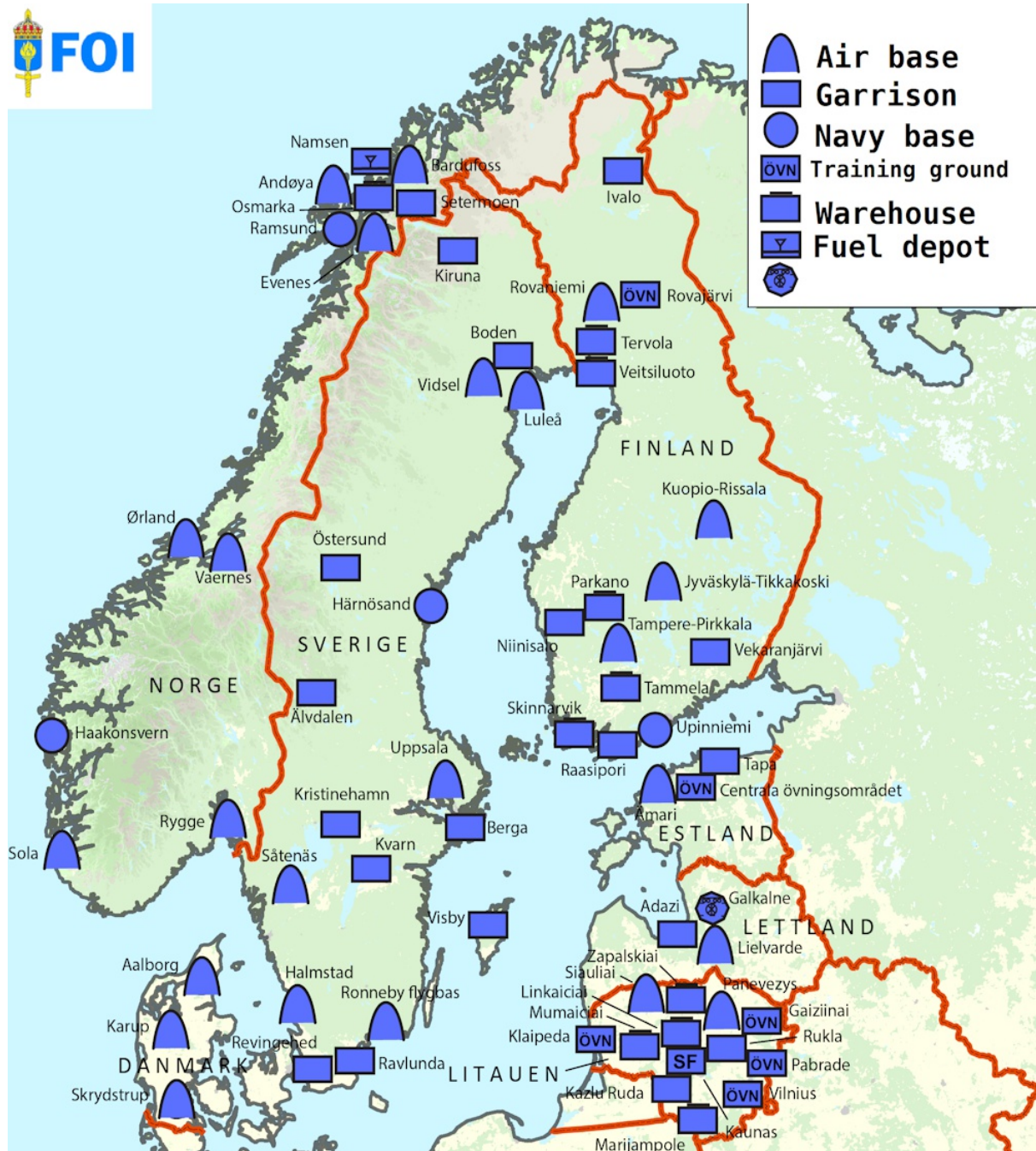


Figure 1. Map of agreed facilities and areas in the Nordic and Baltic countries. Source: FOI, The Swedish Defence Research Agency

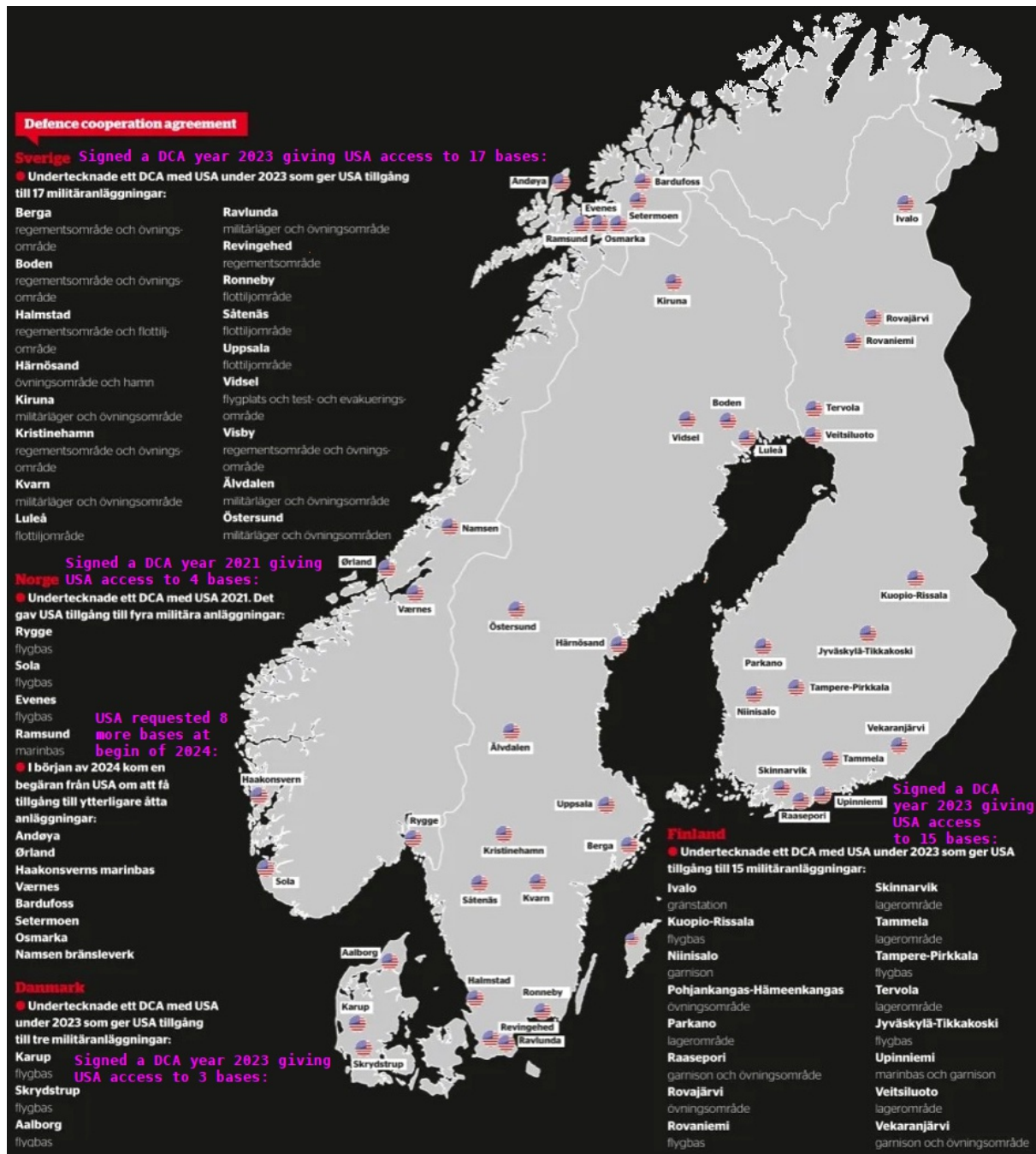


Figure 2. The map above shows the totally 49 military bases in the Nordic countries covered by identical military bilateral agreements between the individual countries and the United States. Source: Newspaper ETC 2024-03-11, page 7

Events and observations up to 2025-12-31

Events and observations place by place

Events and observations are listed below from north to south for the 17 base areas of the DCA agreement + locations for development, testing and manufacturing

Giron AKA Kiruna

- 241203: NEAT the "North European Aerospace Test Range" is Europe's largest war exercise area - Esrange and Vidsel. At NEAT, tests of various spacecraft are performed. Missile tests can be carried out by using a barred area of 1650 km². Similarly, the launch of measuring rockets, and stratospheric balloon flights are carried with help of a rocket ejection ramp, ground installations, and a reserved land area of 5200 km².
- 250815: Plans of The Swedish Armed Forces and the U.S. Armed Forces for Kiruna conflict with the mining company LKAB's plans to expand the iron ore mining in the Kiruna mine, since the ore body reaches under the area of the planned base.
- 260102: Norwegian "Finnmarksbrigaden" strengthens defence at the border between Norway and Russia due to the increase in hybrid threats. The future cooperation with Sweden and Finland within NATO is highlighted as an important part of the work of the brigade chief.

Esrange

- 251204: The U.S. has de-facto taken over Esrange through an official "dual use" i.e. one cannot distinguish civilian and military use.
- 250621: Foreign Minister Maria Malmer Stenergard signs an agreement with U.S. opening up Esrange to U.S. space companies and space industry cooperation. Esrange is planned to be expanded for 1'000'000'000 SEK over a 10-year period. The nearby reindeer herding district protested because the Sami people are worried about space debris that can disrupt their activities.
- 251007: The Saarivuoma reindeer herding district ordered an environmental impact assessment for The Swedish National Space Agency's application for an extension of activities at Esrange. The reindeer herding district opposes the construction of two landing sites in the mountains, concrete slabs 40 x 40 meters fenced in areas 300 x 130 meters with roads to the places. Because Esrange can control the rockets, they might as well let them land on Esrange, according to the reindeer herding district. It is the government that decides in the matter. The Swedish Space Agency has hired the Thyren's consulting company from Umeå to do a reindeer herding analysis.

The reindeer herding districts Talma and Lainiovuoma, which are also affected, did not submit any own report.

Vidsel

- 250325 Bomb drills were conducted in Vidsel.
250912 Test of anti-aircraft missile in Kåbdalis, Vidsel.

Boden

- 251128: The Hunting and Fishing Sami people are worried about the Swedish Armed Forces' plans to double the area for its shooting range in Arvidsjaur. The plans may, among other things, severely impact the Mausjaur reindeer herding district.

Jennie Granberg, member of the "Sametinget" Sami Parliament proposes that the Sami Parliament initiates a dialogue with the Swedish Armed Forces to discuss the consequences of the defence's expansion for the Forest Sami and their reindeer herding in general.
- 251204: New huge shooting range in Arvidsjaur with size comparable to twice the center of Stockholm.

- 251214: The military wants to double its area in Arvidsjaur, large operations are expected by spring in Norrland.

Luleå

- 250508: A Sami shamanic sacrificial site was used for a rocket reconnaissance centre, and is now a classified facility.
- 250605: A lot of fighter flight exercising activity. Many military transports towards the Finnish border. The ACE "Arctic Challenge Exercise Luleå" started on May 26 and lasted for 3 weeks. It is a recurring training together with NATO countries, that has been prolonged from 2 to 3 weeks. The previous one was held in 2023. They continue the training with extremely high noise levels and low flying altitudes during this improper time when animals get cubs, causing animal families being shattered.

Umeå

- 250121: The military wants a transport route from Mo i Rana in Norway to Holmsund, the port of Umeå. Umeå municipality has announced interest. The Armed Forces are expanding. Not only is the right of access to the wilderness being restricted, but also the right of ownership. Fining has occurred when cycling into the area. Reindeer herding is disturbed.
- 251204: Intensive artillery activity on 3 December. A popular area located northwest of Umeå is increasingly being used by the military. People have been fined for intrusion into "banned areas" that appear on online maps, but are not physically fenced.

Örnsköldsvik (BAE)

Härnösand

- 250121: There is an amphibious regiment in Härnösand, and there are plans for an expansion of the area. The Home Guard educates. Controls have been tightened. Previously this was an outdoor recreation area, but now the trails (skiing, hiking, running) have been closed. Penalties for unwelcome access have been issued. There are a lot of military transports on the adjacent E4 highway, and large contingents seem to stay overnight.
- 251009: The port is being "upgraded" and the Fortifikationsverket authority has purchased land.
- 251113: Much training on the shooting range. Also military transports were observed, and Härnösand appears to be an intermediate stop. Land is being purchased, among other such previously owned by the Coastal Artillery.

Östersund

- 251023: Östersund is described by two retired officers as an important support area for allied military operations, as well as operations towards the east. A variety of materials are listed which would be stored there during peacetime. It is recommended that Sollefteå Hospital should be maintained and strengthened as an emergency hospital.

Älvdalen

- 251027: An upgrade of the railway is planned to create a connection between Bergen and Gävle (west – east). Currently the railway from the south reaches to Malung only. Now it is planned to extend it to the Norwegian border beyond Högfjällshotellet (Sälen), and additionally northwards to Älvdalen where a shooting range is located. Currently a civilian airport for seasonal use lies on the planned railway route towards Norway. NATO exercises are already taking place in the area. The airport is now called Scandinavian Mountains Airport. The planned railway will be called Scandinavian Mountains Railway.

The municipality and the business community informed about the project, claiming that the strong link between the airport and the railway will significantly increase the strategic importance of the region. The new railway line would offer dual use with economic and sustainability benefits. It meets the EU's objectives for military mobility and resilient infrastructure, opening up for EU funding. The railway line is planned to connect the Norwegian west coast with the Baltic Sea to facilitate Swedish, Norwegian and Nordic defence and increase NATO's capabilities in its Northern areas. The initiative allows a strengthened NATO cooperation by facilitating rapid mobilization and efficient coordinated logistics, and also enables comprehensive and efficient evacuation.

According to the information, the project should not bring any local tax burden, but instead generate jobs.

Uppsala

- 241203: The parking area for the Academic Hospital's ambulance helicopters was closed after Ärna air flotilla had become a DCA base. Nature reserves have been stopped by the "Länsstyrelsen" County Administrative Board.
- 250121: The nature protection area near the air flotilla is cancelled.
- 250224: Private drinking water wells in the area of Ärna air flotilla are found to have too high levels of PFAS. <https://www.aftonbladet.se/nyheter/a/Rzn558/forsvarets-pfas-prov-visade-felaktiga-varden> The Land and Environmental Court of Appeals delivered its judgment on 9 April 2024. The Swedish Armed Forces must bear the purification costs that have occurred so far due to the PFAS pollution. <https://www.uppsalavatten.se/hushall/vatten-och-avlopp/dricksvatten/domstolsforhandling-pfas>
- 250501: The Air Force Chief Jonas Wikman announces that the multi-billion investment of the Armed Forces into the new radar reconnaissance and command aircraft 5106 will be carried out at F16 and Arlanda. Initially, three aircraft will be placed on the F16, and another one may be added later. The aircraft will then start from Arlanda for various missions. In order to allow the new radar reconnaissance aircraft to operate from F16 and Arlanda, new constructions are required in both places. Sources: Swedish Armed Forces, F16 and Fortifikationsverket.

Kristinehamn

- 250121: A new base is being built, after the former one had been decommissioned during the 1990s. The decision to restart there was taken already before the membership in the NATO was accomplished. The recreation area previously publicly accessible is now affected by restrictions. Military presence north of Kristinehamn. Military transports along road 45 to Älvdalen or perhaps Östersund increased significantly during the last six months.

Karlskoga (Bofors)

Skövde (Elbit Systems)

Berga

- 241203: The Swedish Armed Forces veto residential construction within their area of influence.
- 250815: Military exercise "Archipelago Endeavour 25" outside the military base Berga in the southern Stockholm archipelago with a battalion, 500 soldiers, from the U.S. Marine Corps and soldiers from Berga:s amphibious regiment. The purpose of the exercise is to synchronize the Swedish and US-American units, and teach the US Armed Forces to navigate the Swedish archipelago. Only patrol boats and smaller vessels were used, and the exercise was expected to end in mid-September.
- 251113: Barracks are built for uncertain purposes. The port is being expanded, and according to the local newspaper Nynäshamnsposten there is a NATO submarine in the waters.

Kvarn

Vättern

- 250121: Permits for shootings from Karlsborg increased from 1000 to 69'000 per year. Severe problems with PFAS emissions. Talks about curtailing shore protection around Lake Vättern are ongoing.
- 250605: Measured levels of PFAS are twice as high as allowed.
- 251101: The Swedish Fortification Agency digs on the behalf of the Swedish Armed Forces drainage ditches being about a meter deep in contaminated soil, and lowers the level of groundwater containing high levels of PFAS. This threatens Vättern as a source of drinking water for hundreds of thousands of people, and this in turn can harm both human health and important parts of the ecosystem. Drainage water polluted by PFAS is sent directly to the Vättern water protection area without any treatment, and 52'000 tons of PFAS-contaminated soil and 37'000 tons of old asphalt are being disposed in embankments being several kilometers long next to the shore of Lake Vättern.

Linköping (SAAB)

Sätenäs

- 241203: Much air force activity with JAS 39 Gripen. In August, a military column of a size that hadn't been witnessed since the 1990s appeared on the road.
- 250223: Global Day of Action to #CloseBases: A manifestation of two people took place outside the gates of the military base. Songs were sung and filmed, and photos were taken.
- 250605: Four private wells were found having too high levels of PFAS. The Swedish Armed Forces do not take responsibility, but provide the residents with bottled water until the wells are sanitized.
- 251020: The "Försvarets materielverk" Swedish Defence Materiel Administration delivers the first units (of a total of 100) of JAS 39 Gripen E to the Armed Forces Unit at Skaraborg Airfleet F7.

Gotland

- 241203: The military started to buy up land and even the hostel, and to use the port. Activities all over Gotland, not just Visby. The submarine port is expanded in Fårösund. The Armed Forces block installation of wind turbines and electrical cables.
- 250121: In Fårösund, the Armed Forces started to buy back land, for example next to an eco-village.
- 250325: Large marine exercise took place in Visby, and parts of the port were closed off. In Fårösund the port is being rebuilt. The regiment KA3 has been given new life, shooting exercises occur every week.
- 250605: A lot of exercises with JAS 39 Gripen. The Armed Forces re-seize the P18, which had been closed in 2000. This expansion means that a building permit for a new school is stopped.

- 250624: Article series in the "Gotlands Tidningar" newspaper. The Armed Forces stop various construction plans on the island, such as private homes, energy parks, school buildings, etc. The military's re-establishment on the island began in 2016, and since then more and more civilian projects were stopped by the Armed Forces citing the military as a supreme national interest. The submarine port in Fårösund was repurchased by the Swedish Armed Forces in 2018, and contracts with civilian partners began being terminated, which made it more difficult for both companies and cultural activities. Region Gotland's planning unit had to cancel several planning processes.
- 250721: The Swedish Armed Forces prevent the expansion of Värsterhejde school.
- 250911: The Tofta firing range was expanded noticeably.

Halmstad

- 251126: The Swedish Defence Materiel Administration invests in air defence systems for 2'000'000'000 SEK. Halmstad is the center of air defence training in Sweden. <https://www.svt.se/nyheter/lokalt/halland/miljardsatsning-pa-luftvarn-sa-paverkas-lv6-i-halmstad>
- 251214: Expansion of the railway from the port of Halmstad. Halmstad municipality is building a railway tunnel for 45 million SEK against the will of the local politicians in order to meet the needs of the Armed Forces and NATO, as "Aftonbladet" reports. The tunnel runs under a new highway interchange at the port, and is so far funded by the municipality .

Ronneby

- 250121: The runway at the airport shared by civilian and military aircraft – F17 Kallinge air flotilla – is being expanded to be able to accept larger planes. There have been mentioned risks with hydrazine (fuel for missiles and emergency electricity generation) that is explosive and carcinogenic. The emergency services highlighted in their referral opinion the general risks of DCA, and what major demands for expansion and training it entails for them and the municipality .
- 250218: The submarine fleet in Karlskrona is being upgraded. F17 in Ronneby is being prepared to be able to service and maintain aircraft such as F-16 with hydrazine. In addition, a new shooting range and a larger exercise area are being prepared.
- 251009: A lot of operations at Kallinge, and a new wider entrance is being built. Training of fighter pilots for takeoff and landing in the dark is ongoing.
- 251204: A U.S. military transport aircraft landed on the F17 air flotilla.

Ravlunda

- 241203: The Armed Forces buy houses and pull up prices, but then leave the houses unused.
- 250223: Global Day of Action to #CloseBases: 27 people gathered for a manifestation on Juleboda beach, near the border with Ravlunda. Then police followed the group from Simrishamn in order to, as they said, "protect them against possible threats". When the manifestation was dissolved and most participants had left, 3 people were required to present their ID cards.
- 251009: During October there were shooting exercises almost every day.

Revingehed

- 241203: The exercise area coincides with a nature conservation area and includes among other things "Krankesjön", a fine bird lake. The military requested from the municipality to reroute the "Skåneleden" trail that runs through the area.
- 250121: Hundreds of cattle animals are being displaced, as they are no longer allowed to graze inside the military area.
- 260119: Lively activity at the Southern Scanian Regiment P7 in Revingehed with many exercises in the field and training of about 500 conscripts. The regiment is also responsible for staffing the army's force contribution to the NATO multinational brigade in Latvia.

Other reports

- 241203: Very extensive shooting in the Göteborg archipelago. There is talk of establishing an amphibious regiment at the exit from the Göta River, near Vinga.
- 250129: Environmental monitoring by the "Vätternvårdsförbundet" association shows elevated levels of PFAS in several fish species, mainly char and perch. Even crayfish from Lake Vättern is now covered by the dietary warnings for fish. During the summer of 2024, samples of crayfish from twelve sites in Lake Vättern were taken to investigate the levels of the environmental toxin PFAS. The analyses show that the PFAS levels in crayfish are elevated in many of the samples, but still generally lower than in fish. After consulting the Swedish National Food Agency, the county administrative boards around Vättern chose to include crayfish in the existing dietary warnings for fish from the lake. The dietary recommendation for limiting the intake of PFAS from fish and crayfish from Lake Vättern is: Not more than 2 to 3 times per year for children, adolescents, pregnant, breastfeeding women and those who want to become pregnant in the future. A maximum of 12 times per year for others.

- 250508: The Kosta exercise and firing range (belongs to the navy), Småland, is to be expanded.
- 250605: The Swedish Armed Forces expropriate land and real estate next to Hagshult military airfield, Småland.
- 250821: A center for NATO coordination in the Nordic region is established in Enköping. On the government's website, one can read that "The Government has commissioned the Swedish Armed Forces to offer NATO the establishment of a staff for logistics management in Sweden. The Swedish Armed Forces shall also prepare and implement the establishment so that the staff can operate by end of 2027". Furthermore, it says "The proposal means that about 70 people from different NATO member countries will be placed in Sweden in peacetime. This number could increase to 160 people in case of elevated preparedness or war. This staff will be handled centrally by NATO and obeying the "Joint Force Command" in Norfolk in England and will not be part of the Swedish Armed Forces.
- 250911: Västerås Airport may be converted for military use. Västerås is located near Enköping, where the establishment of two NATO staffs is under discussion. One for the coordination of logistics for the northern flank of NATO, and the other for radio and telecommunications for the same.
- 250930: Interview with politicians in Göteborgs-Posten: The Port of Göteborg has been identified as the most important port in the Nordic region. According to the assessors, this infrastructural hub needs to be defended at all costs. There is concern that the Port of Göteborg may be forced to close.
- 251113: In Varberg, increased quantities of civilian US-Americans can be met. There are many military transports on the railway line after a recently completed rerouting.

- 251117: The company "Train Alliance" bought a large area north of Ånge to build a freight terminal facing the ports in Trondheim and Sundsvall and connecting to the northern main line. The area and the terminal are considered suitable for both civilian and military transports, and are linked to a major civilian railway upgrade in Moradal. The terminal enables a central northern facility suiting the NATO's need for an arsenal of weapons. Concerns that Ånge will be a target for attack are being dismissed by local politicians with the argument that U.S. military and NATO personnel will provide the necessary defence.

- 251212: Stop for aircraft at Säve airport: the air traffic control will be decommissioned, the runway will be shortened, but the air traffic control tower will remain. However, there is disagreement about what Säve should be used for. The municipality wants to build a logistical center, while arguments are raised that the airport must remain in place to enable military accessibility if the Port of Göteborg becomes the subject of NATO interests. There are proposals to develop Säve into a military base. The area features mountain hangars and has a military strategic value.

Generally in the country

- 250225: Linus Hagström writes in Aftonbladet that he believes that Sweden should investigate whether/how the DCA can be terminated, citing U.S. actions internationally and Donald Trump's return to the presidency. "American foreign policy now shows paranoid and manipulative traits similar to that of Russia, and Sweden must therefore act with the same determination towards both states. This means setting clear and firm boundaries to avoid being controlled and exploited. After 80 years as a pseudo-allied and later ally, it will be more difficult to sever the emotional dependence on the United States, but Sweden should urgently investigate the possibility of terminating the DCA agreement and firmly avoid buying more U.S. weapon systems."
